Source: London, British Library, K.10.a.17.(3.) : a manuscript in the hand of Wolfgang and Leopold Mozart, dated July 1765. Bracketed accidentals and dashed slurs are editorial. Ties have been added to the penultimate notes of the tenor and bass parts. Some editions suggest an E natural in the tenor at bar 20; while that may be a harmonic improvement, there is no suggestion of it in the source, written when Mozart was nine.

The text is the King James Version of Psalm 46, verse 1.
