

(1589 - 1672)

London, RCM: Barnard partbooks, MSS 1045-1051.

Cambridge, Peterhouse: Latter Caroline Set MSS 36, 37, 42, 43, 44, 45

Oxford, Bodleian: Batten organ book, MS Tenbury 791

The music is presented at pitch in original note values.

The Peterhouse books lack any Contratenor parts; the Barnard books have only the Primus for each side. The Contratenors divide in Verse sections, but are largely in unison in the Choruses, except for a handful of notes in an otherwise identical passage, e.g. bars 10, 18 and 25. There is rarely 'harmonic room' for an additional Contratenor part to be construed. The two Contratenor books lack any music for the first 7 bars of the Nunc dimittis, and an editorial Contratenor line has been supplied. (The editorial notes are also included in the organ part, which might suffice.)

The organ book presents the music for the Choruses 'at pitch'; but the Verse sections are written in various transpositions.

#### **MAGNIFICAT**

- 5: Source has "sprit hath rejoiced".
- 5, Contratenor: Source has a D for first note.
- 7, Tenor: Source has F. Changed to G.
- 42, Contratenor: This two-bar phrase is originally in the Medius and Contratenor parts; moved to divisi Contratenor parts.
- 67: Something seems wrong here, but it may just be bad writing.

102 and 119, Contratenor: Upper notes added editorially, matching those in the source at bar 25.

#### NUNC DIMITTIS

3, Medius Cantoris: Sources have D for last note, creating octaves with the Tenor. Changed to F natural.
